ABOUT THE UFUND START U READING SERIES

WHO WE ARE:

The UFund Start U Reading series is an educationally based statewide, year-long youth literacy initiative that visits various demographic communities. It is designed as a public service to educate parents on different ways to read together with your children while informing parents about the free services MEFA provides to MA residents.

WHAT WE DO:

The event begins with an introduction about the UFund and the benefits of saving for college while children are at the toddler and pre school age. An interactive reading event follows created to engage preschoolers imaginations. A costume character takes families deeper into books just read through interactive exploration techniques. Photos with characters are encouraged while each family leaves with a bag filled with information courtesy of MEFA.
