Derek, one of our high school juniors, was reading a sample chapter of American Sniper and wanted the rest of it. I told him I would include it in my current book order which would take about two weeks. He said thanks but didn't seem enthusiastic. Derek started to walk away when I remembered the Commonwealth eBook Collection! Ten minutes later, he was happily reading chapter two of the book. A couple of days later another student came to me asking for a "phone book," and he was not looking for the yellow pages. My students like instant gratification.

I like the way the Common eBook Collection has exponentially increased my small school library collection. I had a Spanish teacher assign a project requiring something on the topic of "mariachi music" and we were able to find an entire chapter devoted to the topic, thanks to EBL.

Teachers at my school like that students can simultaneously use the BiblioBoard component of the eBook collection. Our brand new class, "History of Espionage and Spying" doesn't have a textbook, so how convenient that every student in the class can access the History of Espionage: Spycraft Through the Ages collection at the same time for their research. The library is working with another social studies teacher on a bias unit using biographical graphic novels of political commentators. The class is looking forward to the smack down between Jon Stewart, Stephen Colbert, Glenn Beck and Bill O'Reilly.

Steve Potash founded OverDrive in 1986 and built it into the predominant provider of ebooks, audiobooks, and other digital media for American libraries and schools. It is estimated that OverDrive has about 90% of the US public library market. So when the company announced March 19 that it would be purchased by Rakuten—a large international online retailer and econtent provider based in Japan—there were plenty of questions about what it will mean to libraries and to library users. "The question [in the dispute with Amazon] was whether the publisher or the retailer should fix selling prices for electronic books (and take account of the fact that many decisions taken in the United States have an impact elsewhere).
